The CDC defines social determinants of health (SDOH) as the "nonmedical factors that influence health outcomes," including the "conditions in which people are born, grow, work, live, and age, and the wider set of forces and systems shaping the conditions of daily life."1

The risk of mental illness is closely tied to SDOH, including poverty, stress, unemployment, and more.<sup>2</sup> Psychiatric pharmacists can improve health outcomes for people negatively impacted by SDOH.

## Psychiatric Pharmacists...

**Psychiatric Provider** Shortage<sup>3</sup>

About a third of adults with serious mental illness, like schizophrenia or depression, are **not receiving treatment**.<sup>4,5</sup>

...Collaborate with psychiatrists to manage medications, extending their reach.

**Need for Quality** Improvement in **Health Care** 

About 16% of older adults use inappropriate medications and the number of fall-related deaths is increasing.<sup>6,7</sup>

... Are medication experts, trained to simplify regimens and make them safer. Inappropriate medications can increase the risk of falling, impair cognition, and may be risk factors for dementia.8

## PSYCHIATRIC PHARMACISTS EXTEND THE REACH OF PSYCHIATRIC CARE



**JAMES** has schizophrenia, a serious mental illness, and takes a highly effective medication called clozapine which can cause rare but serious side

effects. James lives in rural Virginia, more than 30 minutes from his psychiatrist in Richmond. He is seen by the psychiatric pharmacist in a rural clozapine clinic, a dedicated service for patients just like James. In collaboration with James' psychiatrist, the psychiatric pharmacist orders and reviews laboratory monitoring to assess for side effects like increased cholesterol and blood sugar and low white blood cells.

The psychiatric pharmacist measures the amount of clozapine in James' blood and optimizes the dose to ensure that his symptoms remain controlled. She educates James about the importance of taking his medication so he knows how to take it and what to expect throughout his treatment.

## PSYCHIATRIC PHARMACISTS IMPACT EDUCATION ACCESS AND QUALITY IN PUBLIC HEALTH



MARTINA coordinates the naloxone distribution and education program for the county health department. Martina works closely with a psychiatric

pharmacist to review a new naloxone education handout and presentation for medical accuracy. The psychiatric pharmacist assists Martina by providing educational classes to members of the community about how to use and obtain naloxone. This helps the public learn how they can help combat the opioid overdose epidemic and ultimately reduce the number of opioid-related deaths in their community.

# **Psychiatric Pharmacists...**

**Food Insecurity** 

While the number of households with food insecurity are improving, 15 food insecurity is highly prevalent among people with severe mental illness.16

...Screen and refer patients with food insecurity to community resources (e.g., supplemental nutrition assistance programs).

... Educate patients on the minimum amount of food required for medication to work and may recommend alternative medications for patients with food insecurity.

**Inability to Afford Prescription Medications** 

While the number of people who can't access medications due to cost is improving,17 cost remains a barrier to accessing medications for many patients with severe mental illness, especially among those that are uninsured or underinsured.

... Assist patients in accessing manufacturer assistance programs, optimize Medicare Part D coverage, and make recommendations to providers for lower cost alternatives.
